Ashley Forest Homeowner's Association Board of Directors Nomination

According to our by laws each of the Board of Directors is elected to serve a term of two years. The Board members' terms are staggered so that there will always be experienced Board Members on the Board. Each year around the first of October a flyer is sent out to all homeowners for Board of Director nominations.

Generally 2-4 weeks are provided to return the nominations to

Volunteers We Need Your Help Become a Board Member the Board. Unfortunately the only nomination forms returned are from Board Members and perhaps one or two homeowners.

As a result, your Board Members have and are serving extended terms.

This year we have three terms up for renewal. Instead of only mailing the nomination forms to homeowners the Board would like to supplement the mailing by soliciting nominations, in writing, at our Annual Block Party. Nomination forms will be provided at the sign in desk and may be turned in at the same time – i.e. one stop shopping – plus food, drink, and fun!

This is an excellent opportunity for those of you who have expressed a desire to serve or know someone who has said they would like to serve. On average the Board meets once a quarter and Board Members spend about

10 hours per quarter on Association business.

You may nominate an AFHOA Member for a position by writing his/her name in the spaces provided on the form. The term for each position is two (2) years. The same person may be nominated for more than one position, and you may nominate more than one person per position. However, <u>nominees must be aware of and accept the</u> <u>nomination and only one nomination form per Unit may be submitted</u>. (Article III Membership and Voting Rights, Section 3.2 of the Amended and Restated Declaration of Protective Covenants and Restrictions)

Two years ago we published an article reprinted from the © Association Times that addressed the frequently asked question of why have a homeowners association? I want to remind you of some of the key points from that © Association Times article.

"Your association may be your best tool to protect the value of your home and the quality of your neighborhood...by setting and collecting the maintenance fees required and needed to run an association, maintaining landscaping [and] enforcing deed restrictions [to] protect the value of the community assets – among those being your home."

When we decided to buy our homes we made a decision as indicated in the © Association Times article

"... to buy into a lifestyle and surroundings which include many things outside the home itself, encompassing everything from the subdivision entries, the recreation center, to the general condition of all the other homes in the neighborhood. We purchased with an expectation that [our] property and those in [the] community would be ...

maintained to a certain reasonable standard."

I mention these key points to point out that not only does your Association work to protect your investment, but that everyone has a vested interest in maintaining the guality and esthetics of our neighborhood.

I want to thank all of you for the outstanding effort made by all of you this summer in maintaining the quality of the landscaping and general appearance within the subdivision.

As many of you are aware there have been some homes in our subdivision that have been foreclosed and their upkeep at times somewhat less than what is the norm in Ashley Forest. What you may not be aware of are the exceptional individuals within our community who have quietly come forward to "help maintain the value and esthetics of our subdivision" by providing maintenance and upkeep on these properties without payment or fanfare.

I want to thank all of those "special" neighbors who have volunteered their time and resources for the betterment of everyone in the subdivision.

Neighborhood Recipe Exchange

Deep Dish Chicken Pot Pie

From the kitchen of <u>Debbie Bridgeman</u> 205 Ashley Forest Drive

INGREDIENTS

recipe pastry topper*
tbs. margin or butter
medium leeks or 1 large onion, chopped
c. sliced fresh mushrooms
c. sliced celery
c. chopped sweet red pepper
c. all-purpose flour
tsp. poultry seasoning
tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. black pepper
c. chicken broth
c. half-n-half, light cream or milk
½ c. chopped cook chicken
c. frozen peas
beaten egg

* For a quicker and easier meal, Debbie suggests buying a ready-made Pillsbury pie crust in the refrigerated section of the grocery store.

**Another tip: Make extra next time you grill or bake chicken and store or freeze to have on hand next time you make the pot pie.

1. On a lightly floured surface, roll pastry topper into a rectangle 1/8 inch thick. Trim to a rectangle 1 inch larger than a 2 quart rectangular baking dish. Using a sharp knife or small cookie cutter, cut some shapes out of the center of the pastry. Set aside.

2. In a large saucepan melt margarine or butter over medium heat. Add the leeks or onion, mushrooms, celery, and red pepper; cook for 4-5 minutes or until tender. Stir in flour, poultry seasoning, salt, and black pepper. Add the broth and half-n-half all at once. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly. Stir in the cooked chicken and peas. Pour into the baking dish.

3. Place pastry over the hot chicken mixture in dish; turn edges of pastry under and flute top edges of dish. Brush with egg. Place reserved pastry shapes on top of pastry. Brush again with egg.

4. Bake in a 400 degree oven for 30 to 35 minutes or until the crust is golden brown. Cool about 20 minutes before serving.

"Piece de Resistance" Pastry Topper*

In a medium mixing bowl, stir together 1 ¹/₄ cups all-purpose flour and ¹/₄ tsp. salt. Using a pastry blender, cut in 1/3 c. shortening until pieces are the size of small peas. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon cold water over part of the mixture; gently toss with fork. Push moistened dough to side of bowl. Repeat with 3 to 4 tablespoons cold water, using 1 tablespoon at a time, until all dough is moistened. Form into a ball.
